

Gaisce: The President's Award

This year we had another successful group of Gaisce participants take part in and complete the President's Award. 17 Transition Year and 5th Year students took part in completing their challenge. The Bronze Award participants



(Transition Year students) had to complete 13 hours (1 hour a week) of learning a new Skill, 13 hours of learning a new Sport and 13 hours of Community Involvement. One of these sections had to be doubled – meaning one of these activities took 26 weeks to

complete.

Silver Award participants, the 5th Years, had to complete 26 hours of each of the above mentioned sections. In addition to this, all participants had to complete a 30km (Bronze Award) or 50 km (Silver Award) hike in the Wicklow Mountains. As part of the challenge, we stayed overnight in the Knockree Youth Hostel and cooked our own meals.
