Dear Parents/Guardian,

Since start of January, we have been contacted by local residents regarding the volume of traffic coming through Father Cullen's Terrace especially as some parents drive down the cul-de-sac and drop their daughters at the pedestrian gate.

This traffic is causing considerable hardship to the people of the terrace who often find it very difficult to access their own residences. This residential area is not suitable for the volume of cars that are using it, and this has become a health and safety issue. Following discussion with the Gardaí and representatives of the residents' association I am asking you once again to not drive down the cul-de-sac. I believe it is a reasonable request from the people of Father Cullen's Terrace that parents should drop their children away from the terrace and so ensure a quieter and safer environment for everyone. Two drop off areas that are a very short walk from the school have been provided for students' convenience outside Father Cullen's Terrace.

I therefore ask you in the interest of the local residents and the students of Coláiste Bríde not to drive down the terrace but rather to leave your daughter at a point from where they can walk safely to school. I thank you in anticipation of your co-operation and please feel free to phone me should you need to discuss this further.
