

Subject Choice Guidelines



Points to Consider when Choosing Junior Cycle Subjects

• What are my best subjects?



- Which subjects do I enjoy?
- Which subjects will I need for particular course(s) / career(s)? (N.B.)
- What are the consequences of **NOT** studying a subject for JC?

- Guidance Counsellor




Don'ts of making subject choice!

- Single test result (e.g. Christmas)




Total Number of Exam Subjects

• Maximum of <u>10</u> subjects is permissible for assessment purposes in the JC.



Junior Cycle Subject Levels

- English, Irish and Maths are available at *Higher* and *Ordinary* Level.
- All other subjects are studied at Common Level.
- Decide on levels later



JC Assessment



Most significant change in the Junior Cycle is the area of assessment.



approach to assessment that supports student learning over the three years of Junior Cycle and also measures achievement at the end of those three years.



Assessment will be a mix of ongoing (formative) and end of topic/unit (summative).



Increases the prominence given to CBAs (Classroom Based Assessments).




Most subjects will have a two-hour final exam at the end of 3rd Year, as well as CBAs in 2nd and 3rd Year.

Third Level Education



Third Level Hurdles

- After LC students may wish to proceed to Third Level (e.g. Technological/University).
- Hurdles to Third Level Education:
 - 1) Minimum Entry Requirements
 - 2) Specific Course Requirements
 - 3) Points

1 Minimum Entry Requirements

• Minimum Entry ('Matriculation'): Requirements:

What you have to have before you can be considered at all.



Typical Minimum Entry Requirements

Qualification Title/Level	Min. Entry Requirements
(Level 8) Honours Degree	2H5 grades 4O6/H7 grades
(Level 7) Ordinary Degree & (Level 6) Higher Certificate	506/H7 grades
Honours Degree in certain Institutions/Courses (e.g., Primary Teaching in Trinity)	3H5 grades 3O6/H7 grades



National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ)



Minimum Entry Req's. {Example B}

- As well as **English** and **Irish**, a **Third Language** is required for many of the courses in colleges of the National University of Ireland (NUI)*
- Exceptions to the third language requirement (e.g. Nursing, Science, Engineering, etc.)
- Maths may also be required, depending on the area of study.

^{*} Examples of NUI Colleges = UCD, UCC, NUI Galway, Shannon College of Hotel Management, Maynooth University, RCSI, IPA, NCAD, Burren College of Art, etc.



2 Specific Course Requirements

• These are particular subjects or combination of subjects that you must have to get a place in a specific course.



Examples of Specific Course Requirements

1) Students must study a Laboratory Science Subject for Nursing.

2) Higher Level Irish, Grade H4 for Primary Teaching.



 Biology is not vital; but would be very useful.




Science

 - Speech and Language Therapy (NUIG)




Do I require TWO science subjects?






The <u>Interest Assessment</u> is suitable for everyone to give an indication of areas or types of work that would match your interests.

Specific Subjects or Course Requirements	Minimum grade H4 in Chemistry and H4 in either Physics or Biology. Minimum grade O6/H7 in four other subjects. Subjects must include Irish, English, another language and Mathematics.					


Science

These subjects demonstrate how to explore nature using carefully planned methods, and teach the basic methods and findings of scientific investigation.

Mathematics Science CSI: Exploring Forensic Science [SC]

Artistic

These subjects involve developing creativity and the appreciation of the work of others. This involves learning the methods and techniques of the subject and producing your own work using these skills.



Humanities

These subjects explore the ways in which humans live and communicate in the world. Human life is examined by looking at our past, our present and into our future. These subjects help people to express themselves clearly and develop their reasoning ability.

Students should submit their subject choices, in order of preference 1-6.


Students will be contacted individually if there is an issue with their subject choice.


We will do our best to ensure that every student gets their preferred subjects, but it is advised to include a 5th and 6th option just in case.


